

College Credit Plus (CCP) Information & Parent/Student Acknowledgement Form

1. CCP is a great way for students (grades 7-12) to earn high school and college credit simultaneously at no cost to the student's family***. CCP classes can be taken:
 - At the student's high school
 - At the college/university
 - Online
2. By April 1, students must notify the high school of your intent to participate in CCP in the following school year. This is done by submitting the signed "Letter of Intent to Participate" to Mr. Sutter.
3. Students must meet college readiness/admissions standards set forth by the college or university.
4. CCP college credit will be converted to high school credit using the following conversion:
 - A college class worth 3 or more college credits is worth 1 high school credit.
 - A college class worth 2 college credits is worth .66 high school credit.
 - A college class worth 1 college credit is worth .33 high school credit.
5. CCP students are allowed to earn 30 college credits per year or 120 credits over the course of the eligibility period (grades 7-12).
6. Students are eligible to take college classes during the summer.
 - It is important to recognize that summer college classes are frequently accelerated due to the reduced length of the classes. These classes can easily overwhelm high school students.
7. Students interested in taking CCP classes online need to consider:
 - Online classes are NOT for everyone. Students must pass an online workshop prior to registering for an online class.
 - Maturity and self-motivation are required for students to successfully complete online classes. Procrastination + online classes = Bad news!
 - For students taking online classes, Ansonia HS will make computers and a structured space at the school available to students taking online classes. Ansonia HS strongly recommends that students utilize this resource to work on online class assignments.
8. CCP advising with Mr. Sutter is an integral part of the process. A CCP registration form (Edison) must be filled out for each student before adding or dropping a CCP class.
9. Students must take a minimum of three (3) Ansonia and/or CCP classes per semester.
10. CCP midterm and final grades will be used to determine athletic eligibility for the upcoming quarter of athletics.

11. A student must follow the college's policy and deadlines when adding or dropping a CCP class. Withdrawing from a CCP class after the drop deadline will result in financial responsibility by the student or parent for that CCP class.
12. If a student fails a CCP class, the student or parent is responsible for all financial obligations related to the failed class. In this case, the student or parent will have to reimburse Ansonia High School.
13. CCP probation and revocation of CCP privileges can occur if:
 - A CCP class is failed,
 - Your CCP grade point average (GPA) falls below 2.0,
 - Or you choose to withdraw from a CCP classes after the drop deadline. See Mr. Sutter for more details.
14. Students participating in CCP English classes may be subjected to mature literature as noted in the approved Edison syllabi. Without exception, they will be required to read the assigned material.
15. Good attendance is very important, and it is strongly correlated to student success in CCP classes. Exceeding 10 absences in a single semester may result in a CCP class failure and being held financially responsible for the CCP class fees.
16. Senior CCP students will be responsible for completing ALL CCP class work. This may include completing all work BEFORE the last scheduled senior day (2nd semester) or continuing to attend the class, depending on specific needs.
17. Transportation expenses are the responsibility of the student and parents.
18. The high school's responsibility ceases when the student leaves Ansonia Schools.
19. Students who enroll in CCP will be expected to meet all Ansonia High School graduation requirements; no graduation requirements will be waived.
